Composer's Notes:

The Last Supper Discourse (John 14-17) contain much of Jesus' teaching: about his identity, the kingdom of God, and the life of discipleship. One can imagine the bewilderment of the disciples who are warned of things to come, but Jesus' words throughout are words of consolation, much of which is only understood after the resurrection. This simple hymn may be sung throughout Eastertide, and is also suitable for funerals. As ever, gradually introduce vocal and instrumental parts.
